

Book Ideas



Hot Dog

Themes: Picture Book | Alliteration | Rhyming

- Spark excitement by inviting readers to complete a jigsaw puzzle book reveal.
- Invite students to draw how they cool down during the summer.
- Discuss the meaning of alliteration and have students tap their shoulders when they hear words that start with the /s/ sound while reading or watching the complete book reading.
- Practice alliteration skills with Alliteration Printables.



Maybe Something Beautiful

Themes: Picture Book | Realistic Fiction | Art

- Introduce the book with the <u>book trailer</u>, then prompt students to think about art in their neighborhood What kinds of art do they see? How does this art make them feel?
- Read the story and encourage students to think about how art made this community feel.
- After reading, create a <u>cloth craft</u> to hang in the classroom, school or at home.
- Enjoy more ideas to transform your community into "something beautiful" with these activities.

- Introduce illustrator Rafael López by playing his Audio Name Pronunciation.
- Learn how the pictures were made with this Meet-the-Illustrator Recording for The Day You Begin and discover an inside secret.
- Show the <u>complete book reading</u> of *The Day You Begin*, narrated by the author, Jacqueline Woodson.
- Use the share tool to create a shelf card for the <u>author</u>, adding to book baskets, displays, or shelves to help young readers understand that books have authors and illustrators.
