

Themes: Picture Book | Nonfiction | American Indian

- Build interest for We Are Grateful: Otsaliheliga by watching the book trailer.
- Invite students to write or tell about something they are grateful for.
- Read the book aloud. You can also view a few pages in the <u>ebook preview</u> and listen to the <u>audiobook excerpt</u>.
- Access pre, during, and post-reading discussion ideas, as well as games and activities in this enrichment activity guide.



#### **We Are Water Protectors**

Themes: Picture Book | American Indian | Our World

- Honor Native American Heritage Month by watching the <u>complete book reading</u> of We Are Water Protectors, read by author Carole Lindstrom.
- · Access discussion and activity ideas with this activity kit.
- As a group, reflect on the cultural representation of characters, setting, and events in the story with this <u>Cultural Representation Reflection</u>.
- Extend the lesson by doing a group craft activity with water, food coloring, and oil.

## **Author Study Ideas**



#### Lois Ehlert

- Become familiar with the author by listening to her Audio Name Pronunciation.
- Share the <u>book trailer</u> for *The Scraps Book* then read the book aloud. You can also view the beginning of the book with this <u>ebook preview</u>.
- Encourage students to read other titles by <u>Lois Ehlert</u> noting that she won the <u>Carle Honors</u>
  <u>Artist Award</u>. Have any other class favorites won this prestigious award?
- Use the share tool to create a shelf card for the <u>author</u>, adding to book baskets, displays, or shelves to help young readers understand that books have authors and illustrators.
