### **Book Ideas**



#### Hello, Universe

by Erin Entrada Kelly and Isabel Roxas

Themes: Realistic Fiction | Disability | Bullying

- Grab your reader's attention by watching this book trailer for Hello, Universe.
- Listen to the <u>Meet-the-Author Recording</u> to discover how the author starts stories by asking her characters questions. Ask students how this approach shifts the writing process.
- Use the <u>reader's theater script</u> to learn more about the characters while practicing fluency. You can also read several chapters in the <u>ebook preview</u>.
- Guide conversation about Virgil's feelings of failure. What advice would you give him?



#### A Little Bit Super: With Small Powers Come Big Problems

Themes: Humor | Science Fiction/Fantasy | Heroes

- Read the <u>ebook preview</u> then discuss both the introduction and author's use of graphic novel format. How do the frames set up the plot and problem for this collection of stories?
- Ask students to write their own superpowers on a Post-it note. Share them with a partner and keep them handy whenever they are feeling down. See these <u>discussion questions</u> for even more ideas.
- Listen to one of the 14 stories in this <u>audiobook excerpt.</u> Lead a discussion or ask students to write about how "4 Seconds to Sonder" follows the premise of the book.
- Read and discuss the <u>Fuse #8 interview</u>. What do we learn from going behind the scenes with the book's creators?

#### **Nikki Grimes**

- Explore the author page for Nikki Grimes to learn about her and the awards she has won.
- Browse resources for <u>Garvey's Choice</u>. Read poems from the <u>ebook preview</u> and listen to the <u>audiobook excerpt</u>. Ask students to share what they've learned about Garvey.
- Utilize this educator's guide for more ideas or perform the reader's theater script.
- Invite students to enjoy another title from the author's collection.
