


Invisible Isabel

- Introduce the author by playing the Audio Name Pronunciation.
- Play the first <u>Meet-the-Author Movie</u> to learn why she writes so many different genres of books.
- Invite students to choose two more <u>titles</u> by the author so they can compare the ways she hooks readers in the first few pages. Utilize ebook previews so that everyone has access to the beginning pages.
- Use the share tool to create a shelf card for the <u>author</u> to add to book baskets, displays, or shelves.
